Highlights include school visits to meet participants in our scholarship and leadership program, village visits to AfricAid supported schools, and an eight-day photo safari to spectacular game parks such as Tarangire, Ngorongoro Crater and Serengeti. Best of all, your participation makes possible a two-year scholarship and mentoring for one student!

Day 1/June 10 – ARUSHA: Upon arrival and after clearing customs and immigration at Kilimanjaro International Airport, Tanzania, you will be met and transferred to your hotel in Arusha. Overnight Rivertrees. (D)

Rivertrees is nestled between Kilimanjaro and Mount Meru in natural gardens along the Usa River. Combining old world ambiance, African country elegance, excellent farm cuisine, personal service and genuine warmth from your hosts - Rivertrees is simply a magical place to stay. This small Country Inn accommodates up to 24 guests, guaranteeing privacy, personal attention and service.

Day 2/June 11 – ARUSHA: After breakfast, we'll visit an Arusha Secondary (High) School to see how students learn and what their challenges are. We'll also meet students who are recipients of AfricAid Kisa scholarships, including those benefitting from your safari and personal sponsorship. In the afternoon, we'll return to Rivertrees. Dinner and overnight here. (B, L, D)

Day 3/June 12 – ARUSHA/LOSINONI: Enjoy breakfast, then travel to a nearby school for more learning and activities with students. After lunch, we'll drive to the rural village community of Losinoni. Enjoy drinks around the campfire and dinner. Overnight in our private mobile camp with comfortable classic camp tents. (B, L, D)

Classic camp includes tents with toilet and showers shared with others in the group. The camping gear, equipment and tents are clean and modern, and our cooks prepare delicious bush meals. We provide all the amenities including the sleeping tents, beds and bedding, toilet(s) and shower(s), and a large dining shelter with tables and chairs.

Day 4/June 13 – LOSINONI: Have breakfast, then spend the day learning about the challenges and joys of rural life in Tanzania. A special visit will be made to an AfricAid supported student and her family. A walk in the surrounding hills is possible. Meals and overnight at our private mobile camp. (B, L, D)

Days 5-6/June 14-15 – TARANGIRE: After breakfast, we will depart for Tarangire National Park for game viewing. Tarangire is famous for its grand Baobab trees and large herds of elephants, plus great sightings of animals such as buffalo, zebras, lions and much more. Overnights at Tarangire Safari Lodge. (B, L, D)

Built on top of a high bluff with a breathtaking panorama, Tarangire Safari Lodge is superbly located in Tarangire National Park, providing one of the best views in Africa. Carving out the landscape below the lodge is the Tarangire River, a favorite watering place, which attracts impressive numbers and variety of game. Our luxury twin tents combine the authentic safari atmosphere of 'nights under canvas', with more modern comforts.

Day 7/June 16 – TARANGIRE/NGORONGORO HIGHLANDS: After breakfast, enjoy a last game drive in Tarangire, then we'll drive through Maasailand and make our way into the lush, beautiful Ngorongoro Highlands and to our lodge perched on the crater rim. Overnight Ngorongoro Sopa Lodge. (B, L, D)

This unique lodge clings to the rim of the magnificent Ngorongoro Crater, the largest and most perfect volcanic crater on Earth. Long and low, the lodge is built from local river stone and camouflaged with indigenous vines. Designed to blend completely into the landscape, it is entirely invisible from the floor of the Crater 600 metres below. The lodge takes its inspiration from the prehistoric site of Olduvai Gorge, which lies close by. Linked by arched stone passages and timbered decks, its walls are decorated with stylized prehistoric cave paintings and lit by flaring torches. At the stone heart of the lodge burns a glowing fire, which is kept constantly alight. Decorated with cave paintings, the rooms are strung around the Crater rim. Each has its own rock-enclosed balcony, and all enjoy completely uninterrupted views of the volcanic amphitheatre below.

Day 8/June 17 - NGORONGORO CRATER: Early this morning, we will depart for the floor of Ngorongoro Crater for a game drive with picnic lunch (maximum 6 hrs park service allotted). The Crater is the world's largest unbroken, un-flooded volcanic caldera and a haven for wildlife. This 100-square-mile caldera is home to more than 20,000 large mammals like lions, leopards, elephants, zebras, wildebeest and the rare black rhino. Return to the Ngorongoro Sopa Lodge for dinner and overnight. (B, L, D)

Day 9/June 18 – SERENGETI: After breakfast, spend the morning driving to the Serengeti, game viewing en route. Visit the cradle of mankind, Olduvai Gorge, along the way. The Serengeti's giant ecosystem is home to millions of animals including lions, cheetah, leopards, buffalo, elephants, zebras, impalas, hyenas, wildebeest, hippos, crocodiles and more. Our lodge is perfectly located for the opportunity to see the wildebeest migration in June. Dinner and overnight at the Serengeti Sopa Lodge. (B, L, D)

Nestled in the acacia woodland on the edge of the escarpment overlooking the plains of the south-western Serengeti National Park, one of the most famous parks in the world, and host to the largest and most spectacular annual migration of the wildebeest. 69 standard rooms, all with 2 queen size beds, carpeted, and tastefully furnished with local fabrics and pictures. One entering the room is a lounge with a mini bar. In the front is a veranda with 2 comfortable chairs and coffee table, with glass windows facing the vast Serengeti plains which extend as far as the naked eye can see

Day 10/June 19 – SERENGETI: Enjoy a full day of game activities in the spectacular Serengeti. Overnights at the Serengeti Sopa Lodge. (B, L, D)

Day 12/June 20 – NGORONGORO HIGHLANDS: After a final breakfast in Serengeti, we will depart for the Ngorongoro Highlands, enjoying a picnic en route. Spend an afternoon at leisure at beautiful Ngorongoro Farm House. Enjoy the myriad activities offered here. There is as a NCAA guided walk through one of the very attractive paths in the Ngorongoro Conservation Area. In the afternoon, walk (about an hour) with a guide from the farm who shows how the farm runs, visiting the vegetable garden, farm animals. Optional activities include a vigorous trek (about 2 hours) around the roads of the farm escorted by a Maasai guide who will introduce you to its culture, uses of plants, customs. Or treat yourself to a half or full body massage (extra charge). Overnight Ngorongoro Farm House. (B, L, D)

A small and exclusive lodge facing the Oldeani Volcano and only 5 kilometers from the Ngorongoro gate, Ngorongoro Farm House was built to offer clients an original experience reminiscent of the atmosphere of the old days. The lodge offers 50 large cottages with ample space inside, built on the style of an old colonial farm and rustically decorated with local materials and full of details of good taste, with the purpose of offering our clients an imaginary journey to the life of the days gone.

Day 13/June 21 – ARUSHA: Depart for Arusha after breakfast, enjoying a picnic lunch along the way. Upon arrival in Arusha, enjoy shopping before transferring to the KIA Lodge where you will have use of a day room until your departure. (B, L, D)
